Antique Tractor Pull Rules and Farm Stock Rules

The intent of these rules is to have a fun and safe pull for all if you have any questions or concerns please talk to pull committee. Pull committee will be announced that the drivers meeting. Please see tractor pull classes below.

Rules apply to both Farm Stock and Antique Classes

- 1. Age of Tractor (Exception maybe allowed if approved by the pull committee.)
 - 1. **Antique Tractor** is a tractor series made before 1960 (ie Farmall 560 started production in 1958 but continued to 1963, a 1963 560 can pull antique or Farm Stock)
 - 2. **Farm Stock** tractor is a tractor series that started after 1960 up to 1975 (limited Farm Stock Classes)
- 2. All hooks are \$15 per hook and must be paid before start of the pull.
- 3. Order of Class does not matter when Class D is up all tractors pull in random order. Please be ready to pull when your class is up. First tractor WILL NOT drop and pull again.
- 4. Drivers must be at least 16 years old and have a valid driver's license.
- 5. When hitching and unhitching from the sled, tractors must be in neutral, with the driver's foot off the clutch with hands in the air. The driver must remain seated at all times and keep at least one hand on the steering wheel at all times.
- 6. Drivers must stay in their seats while pulling.
- 7. Anything falling off the tractor after it is hooked to the sled and moving will result in immediate disqualification.
- 8. All classes must pull under a 3.5mph no shifting while pulling the sled will be set to that speed first horn adjust speed failure to do so will result in disqualification. Second horn in same pull results in disqualification.
- 9. Pulling on dirt with automated sled.
- 10. The pull is ended when forward motion stops, the tractor stalls, and the tractor reaches the side boundary or when the driver gets the red signal from the flagman
- 11. No stripping of tractor, must appear stock.
- 12. 2-wheel drive only, rubber tires only, no chains, cut tires or steel wheels.
- 13. Draw bar height 18" maximum on solid drawbar minimum 18" from the center of the real axel. No hydraulic hitch point, unless made stationary.

*** Classes A (0-2500lbs) and B (2501-3000lbs) must have 16" high hitch***

- 1. All pulls start with a tight chain.
- 2. Tires must appear stock.
- 3. One re-start is allowed if sled does not reach 50' mark.
- 4. Tractors will not pull until the track judge has displayed the green flag. When the red flag comes up you are to stop immediately. Drivers are to watch for the flagman once the

tractor is hooked to the sled. The flagman is in control. Failure to follow their directions will result in disqualification.

- 5. Tractor must stay within the boundaries or be disqualified.
- Stock engines, no multi carbs, turbos, etc. no manual overrides on governor, factory throttle only. Any engine 10% under standard rpm will be allowed; over 10% will be disqualified. Random checks will be made. The first place tractor in every class may be checked.
- 7. Absolutely no fuel leaks. Tractors will be safety inspected and any tractors not passing will not pull. Only manufactured recommended fuels, no draining or refueling while engine is running.
- 8. Any tractors operated in an unsafe manner will be disqualified. The speed limit is 4mph before the pull.
- 9. All tractors must cross the scales and have a weight slip for registration. Tractors will scale out if requested; if overweight you will be disqualified.
- 10. Weights will be manufactures equipment, for era of tractor and securely attached. Wheel weights must be secured with bolts, No belly bars, or homemade weight brackets. Tractors should appear as field ready for time of manufacture. 50-pound overweight in all classes except lightweight class, with all removable weights removed.
- 11. Any variation from these rules may pull as an exhibitor.
- 12. Judges, officials, weigh master and boatman's, and pull committee decisions are FINAL Including situations not covered in these rules and during the event.
- 13. NO ALCOHOL BEFORE OR DURING THE PULL!!
- 14. Any puller or person in debt to the Calhoun County of Yesteryear Association will not be able to pull until the debt had been cleared.
- 15. Please have fun and safe pull.
- 16. Weigh in at 8am and pull starts at 10:00am (11 am for Turkeyville Show)
- 17. Classes are listed below but subject to change the day of the pull
